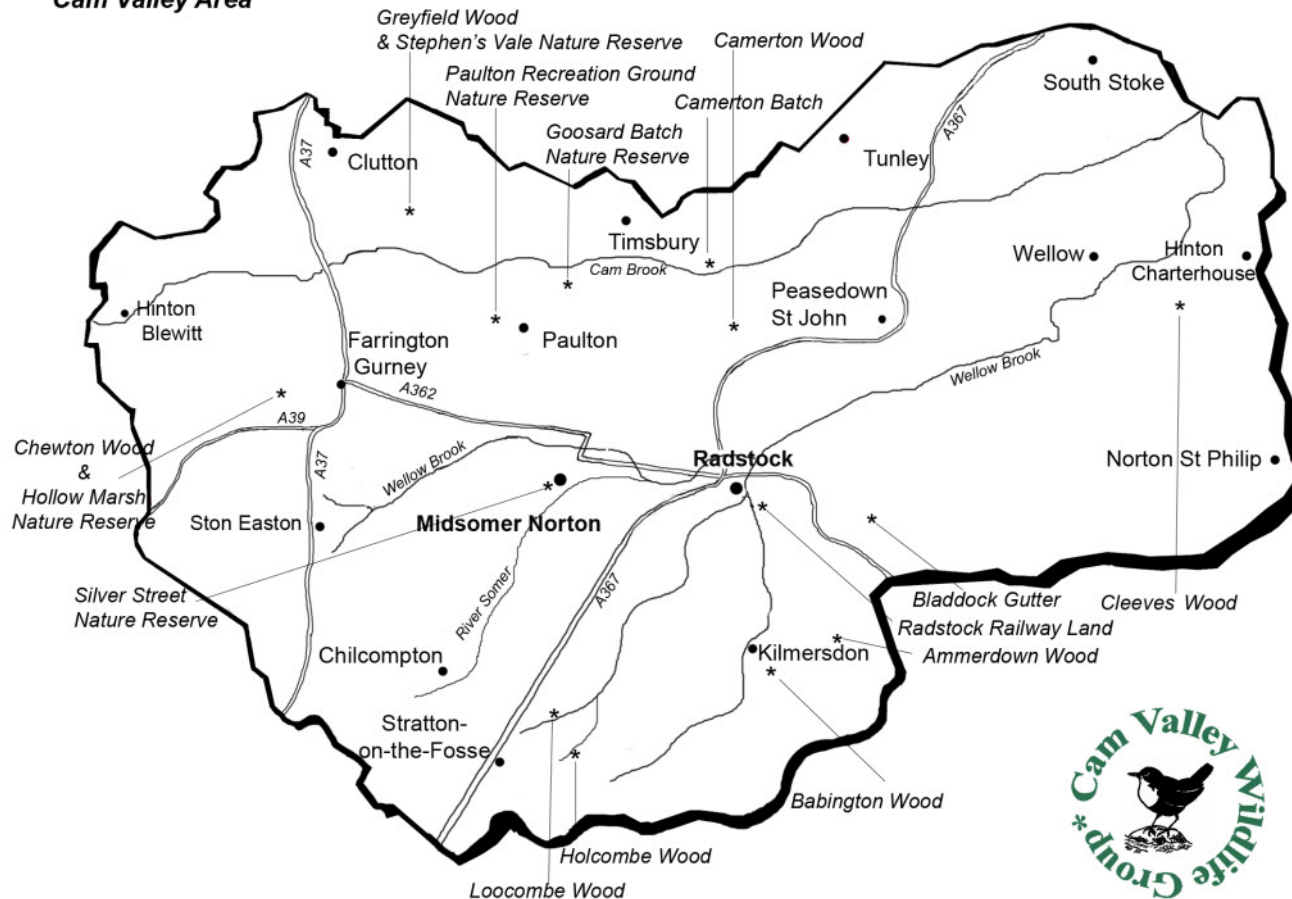

Our activities are many and varied and we:

- Meet socially to share information, plan activities or just have fun!
- Organise field trips in the Cam Valley and further afield.
- Hold talks on wildlife and similar topics.
- Carry out local conservation projects and surveys of local wildlife including:
 - Flora
 - Birds
 - Bats
 - Owls and Raptors
 - Butterflies, Dragonflies and Damselflies
 - Other Insects
 - Small mammals including Dormice
 - Larger mammals such as Otter and Badger
- Work with national and local like-minded organisations on surveys and conservation projects.
- Manage a small number of local nature reserve.
- Encourage landowners to conserve and improve habitats for wildlife and provide advice on habitat management.
- Work with local councils to promote nature conservation.
- Campaign for the protection of valuable wildlife sites in the area.
